God was truly present at My Brother's Keeper this December as we celebrated the birth of His Son by serving our more humble brothers and sisters.

As always, we kicked off our Christmas Program in prayer. A record crowd of 750 attended our 22nd Annual Gratitude Mass with one of our own volunteers delivering the homily, recently-ordained Deacon Brian Kean of West Roxbury. (see photo back page)

Then from December 7th to December 24th, nearly 3,000 children, parents and grandparents volunteered at My Brother's Keeper. Working together, we delivered gifts and food to 2,725 families—10,817 children and adults!—living in 76 towns between Haverhill and Harwich.

All these numbers represent records: more volunteers than ever served more families in more communities in less time... just 18 days, four fewer than last year.

These records are noteworthy because they speak to the passion and vibrancy of our growing community but at My Brother's Keeper, it always comes down to mission, not numbers: did we shine the light of Christ and bring His love and hope to those we serve?

The numerous thank you letters we received are a resounding 'Yes!' Here's one from a family in Whitman who received our help with furniture in November and presents in December:

My family cannot express our gratitude enough for all that you have done for us. Through Jesus and the staff and volunteers at My Brother's Keeper, we have furniture for our apartment and Christmas gifts for our daughter. 


"HALLMARK COULDN'T HAVE MADE A MOVIE BETTER THAN THIS!"

My daughter loved all her gifts and couldn't stop smiling: all she could say was, "This is the best Christmas ever!" Then I couldn't stop smiling in between the tears. I prayed and thanked God for His bountiful blessings that He provided through you. Never in my wildest dreams could I have imagined the things you sent to a well-deserved 5 year old who only gets second hand items but never once complained.



PS: Your volunteer who delivered the gifts also came back with a very special gift for my daughter: a tree. Thanks because he didn't have to do that. This has been a blessed and magical Christmas. Hallmark couldn't have made a movie better than this!"

WITNESS TO FAITH

Anyone who's made Christmas deliveries for My Brother's Keeper understands how special this experience can be. The gratitude and faith of the families we serve is positively inspiring.

I met one such family making deliveries in Fall River with two volunteers, Ellie from Norwood and Brian of Abington. Down a back alley and up a set of stairs above a bar, we found the six members of the 'Jacobs' family crowded into a tiny, two-bedroom apartment. We were greeted warmly by Aubrey, her husband Tom, and newborn Amy, just two weeks old. As we admired tiny Amy swaddled in blankets, Aubrey told us the youngest of their four kids had been a bit of a surprise. In the

same breath, she spoke of the baby as "God's decision" and how He would always provide for the family.

I'm continually amazed at the willingness of those we serve to open up about their lives and spirituality so soon after meeting us. It's a tremendous compliment to My Brother's Keeper and the respectful way we serve.

You wouldn't know it by the kind smiles on their faces, but the past few months had been a serious financial struggle for the family. Tom, a construction worker, hadn't worked in awhile because of the cold weather. With an extra mouth to feed and money so tight, a friend urged them to call My Brother's Keeper for help. Aubrey and Tom faced these challenges with uncommon grace, dignity, and trust. "It is all in God's hands," Aubrey said confidently. "He's always watched out for us and He'll do so again."

After a round of emotional hugs, we were on our way to the next delivery. Aubrey and Tom could now provide a joyful Christmas for their children, but it was clear that our visit had more to do with God's love and hope than the four bulging bags of gifts. Witnessing their faith, we understood My Brother's Keeper was just God's way of taking care of the family in their time of need.



FALL RIVER CHALLENGE GRANT

Our plans to open a Fall River facility in the summer of 2013 took a big step forward thanks to a very generous challenge grant: The Salah Foundation will donate \$50,000 annually for the next five years in support of our Fall River expansion—\$250,000 total — if we can raise matching funds for Fall River.

"Our foundation does not typically make multi-year grants but after seeing the wonderful work of My Brother's Keeper firsthand, our family feels this is one organization worth the exception," said Noreen Salah Burpee, Executive Director of The Salah Foundation. "We are delighted to help My Brother's Keeper grow, include more people in their work and, most importantly, serve a new community in great need."

"The power of a matching grant is that it allows each individual donor to double the impact of his (or her) donation. We have seen this to be a very powerful tool in community fund raising efforts."

The Salah Foundation was made possible through the life-long hard work of James M. Salah, the son of two Lebanese immigrants who came to this country in 1919. The Salahs have always taken great pride in their family, a tradition that has been passed down through the generations. Part of the Foundation's Mission Statement is to support nonprofits that strengthen families and communities.

Our Fall River expansion effort has also received generous commitments from The Flatley Foundation, The Yawkey Foundation and The Lynch Foundation, giving us a solid base of support.
